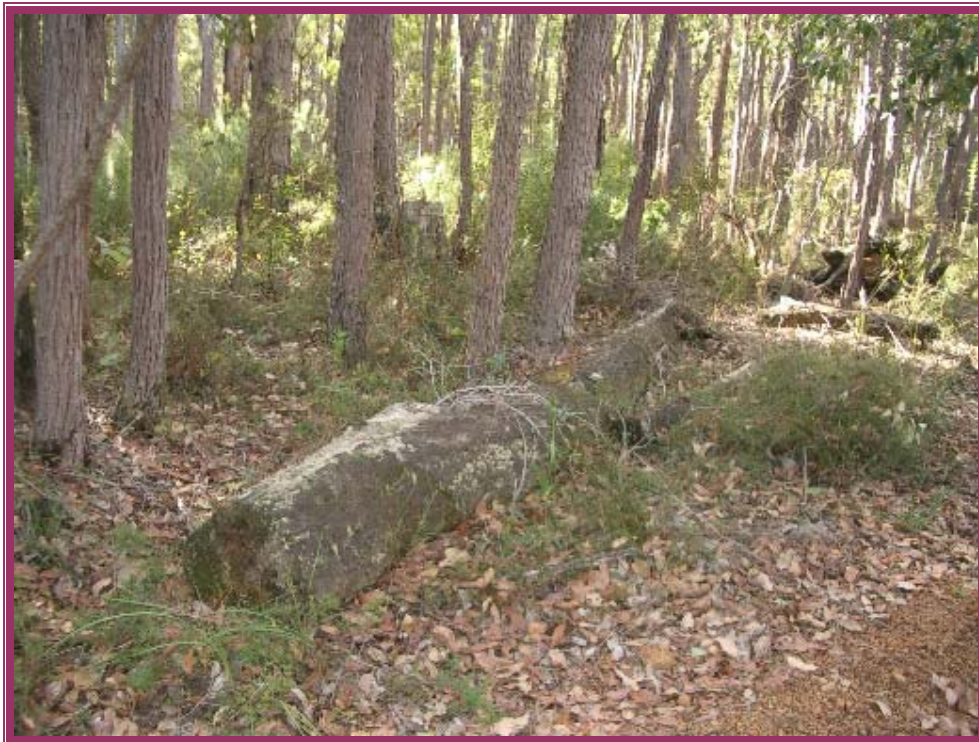

The National Trust's **Natural Heritage Program** protects native vegetation through:

- **Conservation Covenanting**

Under the NTWA Act 1964 the Trust can attach to land titles, at the request of landowners, restrictive conservation covenants. Covenants usually remain on the title in perpetuity, although in some cases a fixed term (minimum 30 years) is negotiated. Covenants provide legal protection for the natural values of the land by restricting activities that could damage the native vegetation. To date 98 covenants have been registered and 10 are in preparation.

- **BushBank revolving fund**

BushBank is administered by the National Trust and managed by a consortium of the National Trust, Dept of Environment and Conservation and WWF Australia. BushBank is a revolving fund established to purchase, covenant and resell land. The proceeds are returned to the capital fund to be used to purchase more conservation properties.

- **Appeals**

As a not-for-profit organisation, the National Trust can establish appeals on behalf of other organisations.

- **Donations**

The Trust receives donations and bequeaths of natural assets which it wishes to manage or sell (subject to restrictive covenants).

- **Advocacy/Education**

The Trust seeks to influence decision-makers in order to develop effective policy and processes to conserve WA's remaining native vegetation. The Trust also advocates on behalf of our covenantors on issues such as land tax exemption and funding.
